dated August 5th, 1871, and recorded in the Registry of Deeds at Halifax in Book 177, at Page 398; from Major John Theakston by deed dated May 1st, 1901, and recorded in the Registry of Deeds at Halifax in Book 345, at Page 573; and from Herbert Harris by deed dated September 1st, 1886, and recorded in the Registry of Deeds at Halifax in Book 272, at Page 239, together with all and singular the buildings and appurtenances to the same in any wise appertaining, is, notwithstanding the trusts contained in any deed, declared to be vested in the United Church of Canada subject nevertheless to all the trusts set forth in Schedule "A" to Chapter 122 of the Acts of the Legislature of Nova Scotia of the year 1924.

## CHAPTER 128

An Act to Incorporate St. F. X. University Students' Union

(Assented to the 30th day of March, A.D. 1965)

Be it enacted by the Governor and Assembly as follows:

- 1 James W. Sutton, Paul J. Rusynak, Thomas Incorporation McGowan, Joseph B. Coffey and Robert K. Hutton, all of Antigonish, in the County of Antigonish, Province of Nova Scotia, and their associates and successors, and such other persons as shall become members of the Union hereby incorporated, in accordance with the provisions of the by-laws are hereby created a body corporate under the name of "St. F. X. University Students' Union", hereinafter referred to as the "Union".
- 2 The objects, aims and purposes of the Union Objects shall be:

- (a) to promote religious, artistic, literary, education, social, recreational and sporting activities for the use and enjoyment of its memers and others;
- (b) to act as the official organization of the students of St. Francis Xavier University, Antigonish, Nova Scotia;
- (c) to co-ordinate, promote and direct the activities of the students of said University.

Powers

## 3 The Union is empowered:

- (a) to take and hold by purchase, grant, lease, gift, donation, devise, legacy or bequest, real and personal property; to sell, lease, mortgage or otherwise dispose of any such real and personal property as may be deemed necessary for carrying out the objects and purposes of the Union; and to invest or otherwise use for the objects and purposes of the Union any moneys received;
- (b) to erect, maintain, improve, repair any building or buildings for the purpose of the Union;
- (c) to borrow money for the puposes of the Union, and secure the repayment of same by any form of debenture, bond, mortgage, promissory note or other security; and without restricting the generality of the foregoing to make and issue debentures or bonds and secure the repayment of same by deeds of trust or mortgage;
- (d) to make, execute, issue and endorse bills of exchange, cheques, promissory notes and such other instruments as may be necessary or convenient;

- (e) to raise money for the purpose of the Union by subscription, the holding of fairs, exhibitions or auctions, the giving of entertainment, the conduct of athletic and sporting events, and other like means;
- (f) to do all such other things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objects and purposes.
- 4 Membership in the Union shall be restricted Membership to persons who are registered students at St. Francis Xavier University, Antigonish, Nova Scotia.
- 5 Membership in the Union shall cease on Termination death, resignation or when any member of the Union of membership ceases to be a registered student at the University.
- 6 The general administration of the affairs of Students' the Union shall be vested in the St. F. X. University Council' Students' Council (hereinafter referred to as the "Council") which shall be elected or appointed from the members of the Union in accordance with its bylaws.
- 7 The Union may, from time to time, make, By-laws amend and repeal by-laws, rules and regulations not inconsistent with this Act or any law of the Province of Nova Scotia for the following:
  - (a) the election of officers and appointment of committees;
  - (b) the convening and holding of meetings of the Union and the Council, the order of business and quorum;
  - (c) the appointment, selection and qualification of officials and employees of the Union;

(d) the conduct, control and management of the affairs of the Union, and generally for any purpose incidental to the carrying out of its objects.

Delegation to

8 The Union may, from time to time, delegate to any committee or committees appointed under the by-laws such powers and duties as may be deemed necessary.

Executions of instruments

9 The Union shall have power and authority by its President or Vice-President and by its Secretary, to make and execute under its corporate seal any deed, lease, mortgage or other instrument relating to the real and personal property of the Union.

## CHAPTER 129

An Act to Change the Name of Elizabeth Jacoba Maria Van Den Berge to Elizabeth Jane Vandenberge

(Assented to the 30th day of March, A.D. 1965)

Be it enacted by the Governor and Assembly as follows:

Change of name

1 The name of Elizabeth Jacoba Maria van den Berge whose birth was recorded in the office of the Registrar in the Municipality of Wolphaartsdijk in the Kingdom of Holland under certificate Number 49, is hereby changed to Elizabeth Jane Vandenberge and from and after the passing of this Act the said Elizabeth Jacoba Maria van den Berge shall be called and known by the name of Elizabeth Jane Vandenberge.

Saving of existing rights and liabilities 2 No rights or liabilities of the party shall in anywise be affected by this Act and the rights and liabilities shall be vested in and be binding upon the party under the name authorized by this Act.
